#Seager v Seager and Seager - Mr Allan appeared for the petitioner, Edward Seager Mr Pharazyn watched the case for Charles Seagar, the co-respondent who had appeared but had filed no answer. Damages were abandoned. Mr Allan stated the facts of the case which set forth that Edward Seagar married Maria Pudney on the 23rd April 1864 petitioner then being about 21 years of age and his wife about 17. Until October last he was under the impression that his wife conducted herself in a proper manner but about that time he had some suspicion that the relations which existed between his wife and brother were of an improper character and acting on that idea he gently but firmly taxed his wife with the fact. She at first flew in a great rage and drew off her marriage ring and threw it upon the ground. Subsequently however she confessed that Charles Seagar had kept up an adulterous intercourse with her for years back and which she confessed to two respectable persons. Petitioner then went to his brother Charles Seagar and upbraided him with his vile conduct. He fell on his knees and begged forgiveness, admitting the truth of all that had been stated by petitioner's wife. Mr Allan then read a letter from Maria Seagar to her mother after the rupture, and when she was on the point of leaving Wellington, in which she admitted her guilty intercourse with Charles Seagar for six years and testified to the unvarying kindness of her husband, Edward Seagar, who she said would tell her mother everything, as she had confessed all, and who she said would get a divorce. She added that her grief was more than she could bear, and that she and her husband had now parted for ever, Mr Jesse Milner certified to the marriage of Edward Seagar and Maria Pudney. James Kenworthy examined, deposed I am a married man, and was intimately acquainted with Mr and Mrs Seagar. About the middle of December 1871, I was told that Mrs Seagar had been inquiring for me several times at my house. On a Thursday night I went with my wife to visit the Seagars, at Woolcombe Street, but there was no answer to my knock. On the following Saturday, in consequence of what Mr Dixon told me, I went to see Mrs Seager. She answered the door. her husband was not within. My wife was with me, I told her I was up on Thursday night, and felt certain there was someone in, as there was smoke coming out of the chimney and the dog was about. She said she was in, but was in such trouble that she could not speak to anyone. She said she was in great grief, and had a great secret she wished to tell me. I told her if she wanted to keep the secret she should not part with it. She said in a few days the whole town would know of it. She said she was going away in a day or two, and only wanted it to be kept till then. She said the secret was that Mr Charles Seagar had taken advantage of her when she was a girl, and that her husband had found it out, and was going to get a divorce from her. I asked her if it had been only before marriage, because in that case surely Edward Seagar might be got to overlook it as it would be such a frightful scandal to be made public. She said it was since marriage and in that very house as well. She seemed very much distressed, and I asked her were there no means of settling the matter without making it so public as by proceedings in a Divorce Court. She said no that she had tried all she could, but that it seemed as if Edward could not bring himself to forgive her. She did not state anything specific as to the acts of illicit intercourse, but I inferred that they had been indulged in continuously. I can't recollect all she said; but later in the evening she said she had great difficulty in getting Mr Seagar to allow her to stop in the house. I asked her to stop at our house that night. I promised to see her off in the morning. She said she must see Mr Dixon first, and my wife and myself went with her and remained outside. She then came to our house. I did not care to mix in the conversation between her and my wife that evening, and though not very quick of hearing I overheard her say that Charles Seagar had compelled her for a long time against her wishes and when he could not accomplish his purpose quietly, he used violence. She said she had for a long time tried to shake him off, but he would not be

shaken off. Living next door, he used to come and visit her at all times, but most frequently just after her husband had gone to work. By the Court she made the confession to me and my wife on account of the friendship which had subsisted between us. What she said was an outburst of grief but the substance of it was that Charles Seagar had taken advantage of her when a girl, and that her husband was about to procure a divorce. As far as I could judge Seagar and his wife lived on very good terms. George Dixon examined, deposed that for the past two years he and his wife had been in the habit of visiting the Seagar's. Was not well acquainted with Chas Seagar. In December, on a Saturday evening, Mrs Seagar came to his house and burst out crying. On being asked what was the cause of her trouble, she went into the room where my wife was, and told us that when she was a girl Charles Seagar, her husband's brother, had taken advantage of her. Witness asked her was it lately. She answered that it had happened both before and after marriage. She also said that her husband was going to apply for a divorce, and that she was going to leave the place for Christchurch on the following morning. On the Saturday morning I saw her and she promised to see me the following morning but she visited me that night instead. Micaiah Read, Warden of Wellington Gaol, examined, deposed I have known the Seagars for several years, and we used to visit each other's houses, and so far as I was able to judge they lived on the most affectionate terms. Mr Seagar appeared to have all his affections centred in his home, and generally to be all that could be expected in a husband. The wife was modest and sedate in her demeanour and when I heard of the affair I was never more surprised in my life. I could hardly think it credible. Their home seemed a happy one, and it was as comfortable as anyone could desire. Edward Seagar (petitioner) examined in the beginning of December, 1871, I first heard of my wife's adultery. About October I first became suspicious of my wife and my brother. I noticed one day that they were more familiar than was proper, and I spoke to her about it. She said she saw no harm in her conduct, and would do as she liked. I was still dissatisfied in my mind, and I determined to watch and endeavour to find out if she had been false to me. In December one day at dinner time we had some words on the same subject, and she got in a passion, and threw her wedding ring and a keeper on the floor, saying, "I will have no more of it." As I was going out of the door to work she said, I may not be here when you come back. On getting home that night I found her greatly agitated. I asked her what was the matter. She replied, Nothing. I said, You have been talking to that man again. She said, How do you know. I answered, By your manner. She then said she would tell me all. She said she had told him that I was suspicious of them, and she thought I had found them out. He answered, Good God, Maria, you don't mean to say that, and told her to go inside and take no notice of what I said. She then upbraided him as a wicked man, who had ruined her. She admitted that during 1867, 1868, and 1869 he used to come regularly and commit adultery with her generally of an afternoon when I was at work. Our houses were only divided by a fence, and he used to jump over the fence. He is a married man. His wife is about 32, and he is about 39. She said that he would come in of an afternoon, and take her upon his knee, flatter her a great deal, and abuse his own wife. He used to profess that she was the only woman he cared for. She said that sometimes when she would not yield to him he would throw her on the floor and overpower her. He used to tell her that if we were all out together she was not to take any notice of him, so as not to rouse my suspicions. She said she used to believe all he told her, and gave way to him. After confessing to me she, said she had told him, and he abused her and called her a great fool for allowing me to find them out, and said he had a great mind to drown himself. He came to my house that evening, and my wife came out into the garden and told me my brother wanted to see me. I said to him, You have been a two-faced scoundrel to me. This is the way you have abused a brother's privilege in coming to the house. He began to cry, and asked me not to expose him. I said, You have been in this house of afternoons and committed adultery with my wife. He said, I have and I will not add insult to injury by denying it. He said, If you will forgive me, I will do anything for you. I answered, No I cannot you have treated me too bad. I then accused him of having committed adultery with my wife when I lived in Vivian Street. He said, I have but if you forgive me I will never do it again. I told him no, that he had done me the greatest wrong one man could do another, and that I could never look upon him again as a brother. He soon left the house. I then told my wife that she would have to leave the house. On her entreaty I did not like to turn her into the street and allowed her to remain for a



day or two. She went away on the 16th, and on the bedroom table she left a letter for her mother. I found it there. (Letter produced and identified.) We never had any cause for unhappiness during our wedded life, and I was never unkind to her and if, as she says in her letter, unhappiness had sprung up within the last twelve months, I am unconscious of it. We never had more than trivial differences. I looked upon her as a spirited woman without being a fast one. Mr Pharazyn said that after hearing the evidence he had no observations to make with respect to the question of costs. The Court said they were quite satisfied that adultery had been committed and that there had been no connivance or collusion in the matter but they would adjourn the case for the purpose of reading the decree. The Court was then adjourned till Wednesday next at eleven o'clock reference Papers past website Wellington Independent newspaper 23 May 1872 page 3

Mr Pharazyn watched the case for the co-respondent Mr J G Allan said that Edward Seagar was the petitioner, Maria Seagar the respondent, and Charles Seagar the correspondent. The petition, set forth that the petitioner was married to Maria Pudney in 1864 in the Registrar's office and that two children were the issue. In the year 1867 and 1868 Charles Seagar visited the wife continually and committed adultery. In October last Edward Seagar suspicions were aroused and subsequently Maria Seagar confessed to her husband that for years she had committed adultery with his brother. She had also made similar confessions to Mr Kenworthy and Mr Dixon. A letter which the respondent left for her mother was read. The registrar of the marriage was put in. Jessie Milner said his wife was Mrs Edward Seagars sister and he was present when Edward Seagar and Maria Pudney were married. James Kenworthy a printer said he had been intimately acquainted with Mr and Mrs Seagar he heard that Mrs Seagar had been several times up to his house in December 1871 he and his wife went up to Mr Edward Seagars and saw Mrs Seagar her husband was not there she said she had a secret she wished to tell him it would only be necessary to keep it secret a few days and it would then be known all over the town, and she was going away the next morning the secret was that when she was young Charles Seagar had taken advantage of her, that her husband just found it out, and was going to get a divorce witness asked if it had been only before marriage, but she said it was since marriage, also, and in that very house she was distressed, and witness tried to sympathise with her, but she said it was no use as she had, done all she could to get him to forgive her she had had a hard job to get Mr Seagar to allow her to stop in the house after being to Mr Dixon's she went and stayed that night at the witness's house, she said she had been badly used by Charles Seagar, and had tried to throw him off he lived next door to them, and used to see her frequently at all times the letter to her mother (produced) was in her handwriting. George Dixon, a married man, said he and his wife had been on intimate terms with Mr and Mr. Edward Seagar for about two years in December Mrs Seagar went to his house, and said she had gone down to tell him a great secret, she said Charles Seagar had taken advantage of her both before and since she was married, and that her husband intended to apply for a divorce she said she was going to start for Lyttelton on the following morning. Micaiah Read said he had been intimately acquainted with Mr and Mrs Edward Seagar, Mr Seagar's conduct as a husband was remarkably good, and the home was all that could be desired Mrs Seagar appeared a most excellent wife. Edward Seagar (examined, by the Court) said he was the petitioned in the beginning of December 1871, he first heard of his wife having committed adultery he first became suspicions of his wife and brother in October he noticed that they were more familiar that they should be, he spoke to her, and she said she said no harm in her conduct, and would do as she liked he was not satisfied, and determined to watch them in the beginning of December they had words and she drew her wedding ring and keeper off her finger, and said would have no more of it, he told her to do nothing she'd be sorry for he went towards the door, when she said she would probably be gone when he returned on going home in the evening she seemed greatly agitated he said, You've been talking to that man again, and she said she had, and she would, tell him all about how he (Charles) had served her she had told Charles witness had found them out, when he had said, Good God you don't say so, go into the house and say nothing about it she said he was a bad man and had committed adultery with her in 1866 in April, -June, and January, and in 1867, 1868, 1869, and 1870 he used to go to the house, and commit adultery with her he generally came of an afternoon, when the petitioner had gone to

his work. Charles Seagar is about 39, and his wife 31 he used to tell the respondent that he only cared for her, and not for his wife she used to give way to him because she believed what he said, after she had made this confession, she said she told Charles, who said she was a fool he came down to petitioner's house next day petitioner said, You've been a two-faced scoundrel to me, you've had the privilege to come into my house as a brother, and this is how you've used me, he began to cry, and said, You won't expose me, witness taxed him with committing adultery with his wife, and he said, I have, and I will not add insult to injury by denying it and that, if he would only forgive him, he would not do it again witness said he would have nothing more to do with him, he went soon, and petitioner told his wife she would have to leave she begged to be allowed to wait a day or two, which she did she went away on the 16th she left a letter for her mother the letter produced is the one they had had trifling differences, but he considered they lived happily together the expression in the letter to her mother that she had been unhappy the last twelve months he did not understand, unless it was that her conscience made her uneasy she was a modest girl in her manner and appearance, not fast, but spirited perhaps. Mr Pharazyn had no remarks to make, after hearing the evidence, as to costs. The Court granted a rule nisi for the dissolution of marriage, returnable at the first sitting of the Court after the expiration of three months from that date. Water-Power - To the Editor - Sir in your issue of the 22nd inst. a letter from Mr Turnbull stated that if anybody went to the gorge of the Hutt river, he would see boulders, stones, and gravel rolling down in thousands of yards. Now, Sir, the Public Works Department had a survey party there four years ago. For nine months I carried their provisions in every week, and I never saw any of those boulders, stones, or running gravel. And the department has had a man there ever since taking the gauges of the water. He has been there four years now, and he has never seen those boulders rolling down the river. Mr Turnbull states running rivers would never do for water power. In the case of the Hutt river, when the dam is built the river bed instead of being confined to one chain wide will be three miles across and two miles long, so the water will have such a wide spread and do away with all removing shingle, as it is only on the flats that the shingle removes from one place to another. Now, Sir, a few words on the great Kaiwarra dam. Mr Turnbull states there was a dam at Kaiwarra about twenty years ago. Forty years ago there was a dam that used to drive a flourmill. At that time the corporation wanted the water for the Karori reservoir, so they left the dam at Kaiwarra with only the drainage of Wadestown and Khandallah. At the same time Mr Shultze, the owner, let the land for quarrying stone to the Government. Mr Lovelock and myself had the contract to get the stone out for the Hutt railway, and the dam was filled in with the waste from the quarry, which in the first place only covered about one quarter of an acre of land compared with the Hutt dam, which will be two thousand acres. He had left the car a few moments previously to get a drink of water. As the car went over one of the girls jumped out, and escaped unhurt. Crawford, also jumped and was comparatively uninjured. The other four (Mrs Pudsey and Mrs Crawford and two children) went with the car, which after a dreadful fall of about thirty five yards struck a log and turned completely over, being smashed to pieces. Mrs Crawford and the children were

thrown out during the car's headlong flight. Mrs Pudsey kept her seat until the car stopped about fifty yards from the brow of the hill, when she was thrown out with great violence. She was unconscious when picked up, and subsequently it was found that she had sustained serious injuries to one of her shoulders, besides minor bruises and shock. One of the girls had received serious injuries to her leg, there being a gaping wound from the knee to the ankle. Mrs Crawford sustained a broken wrist, besides minor injuries, and the boy was badly bruised about the head and other parts of the body.
