### 1913 Township of Wakatiki part of Section 92

- 18 December 1913 from Chief Surveyor to Surveyor General Sundivision into Town Allotments of Part Section 92 Hutt Regision District Block 1 Rimutaka SD I have the honour to forward herewith plan for approval in Council under the provisions of Section 3 of “The Land Laws Ammendment Act 1912” and its Ammdement . There is no twon in the immediate vicinity and the name suggested is “Wakatiki” with Emerytown as an alternative
- 20 December 1913 from Surveyor General to Minister of Lands Town of Wakatiki The accompanying receommendation to the Governor to approve the plan of Wakatiki Wellington Land District is respectfully submitted for your signature should it meet with your approval.

The scheme of subdivision is in accordance with the requirements and the proposed name is suitable. I have the honour to recommend that you exercise the power conferred upon you by section 15 of the Land Act 1908 and authorize the laying off of Stephen Street in the above town of a width of not less than 66 feet. Attached also for your signature is the usual authority for the laying off of the main roads in the town of a width of 66 feet in the event of your approving of the same. (2 copies)

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### **1920-1930**

#### **1913 Township of Wakatiki part of Section 92**

- 26 June 1924 from Chief Surveyor to Surveyor General Town of Wakatiki Extension No 2 O forward herewith a plan of a proposed scheme of subdivision of the owner Mr Charles Edward Clark. The plan has been examined and conforms with the regulations governing surveys of this nature except that the areas of Lots 1 to 7 are not in accordance with Regulations 166. As this regulation however is in conflict with Hutt County by-laws which permit of 1/8 acre lots, and is in itself not binding I would suggest that this scheme be recommended for approval of the Hon the Minister. The question of reserving 5% of the land for public purpose can on account of the smallness of the total area involved I think be also dispensed with.

- PLAN proposed Town of Wakatiki extension No 2 being subdivision part section 92 Hutt Registration District Block 1 Rimutaka SD – Stephen Street – Main Hutt Road – Trentham Station – Wallaceville Station – Moonshine Road – Sandford Street – Merton Street – Tawai Road – Ararino Road – Mungaroa Road – Owner Charles Edward Clark – J C E Cottle CTt 288 folio 238 & CT 206 folio 286 – wooden house and stables on lot 7 - surveyed by C D Truebridge May 1924 – Chief Surveyor 24/06/1924 Minister of Lands 30/09/1924 saved 30/08/2017 as IMG\_
- 29 September 1924 from Chief Surveyor to Surveyor General Town of Wakatiki Extension No 2 Referring to your memorandum of the 3<sup>rd</sup> July last in connection with the scheme of subdivision of the above named Town Extension I herewith submit for the approval of the Hon the Minister an amended Plan of the same. Four of the Lots along Stephen Street have been reduced to three and now practically comply with the regulation as regards minimum area. Lots 4, 5 and 6 have not been altered from the original scheme. These Lots being on the Main Road from part of the Shopping Area which has already been commenced in this part of the district. In order to increase the areas it would be necessary either to lose another lot or shift the south-west boundary of lot 7. As the approach and entrance to the stable loose boxes are on this side it is inadvisable that this should be done. Having made a personal inspection of the Locality I have to recommend that the regulation with respect to the areas of these lots be waived and the scheme as it now stands be approved

- 03 October 1957 from Chief Surveyor to H P Hanify Surveyor Wellington – Town of Wakatiki scheme plan D 227 owner previously J Emery description part section 92 Hutt District part being also Lot 1 & 2 DP 11529 – The above scheme plan was approved by Clerk of the Council on 20.1.1914 and pursuant to Section 3(7A) of the Land Subdivision in Counties Act 1946 approval lapsed on 1/2/1957. The scheme plan has been endorsed accordingly and the following documents have been revoked. The land in this scheme now falls within the limits of the Borough of Upper Hutt.
