No 1 Original Claim 1893 Mauihikono Sections 98 and 102

Weria te Teria and another applicant Plan M D 853 produced but not approved

The Court informed Te Tipene who appeared as agent for Wera te Teira that the case could not be dealt with for the following reasons

[1] There was no approved plan before the Court

[2] It was doubtful whether the Court had Jurisdiction over the land in question as the Native Title had been extinguished and it would be necessary that application be made under Clause 51 of the Act of 1856

Application dismissed

Page 303 – Tuesday 20 February 1894

No Hutt 98 and 102 Mauihakono

The Court explained that the object of the present inquiry was to ascertain the names of the persons who belong to Tauringa Kuri party for whom the sections had been formerly set apart by the Government

Wi Maera te Kanae appeared for the family of Kamiera Takauraenga at the time Tauringa Kuri lived there and before they left the land for Taranaki Iraia Kainiera was then grown up and remembers matters in connection with the occupation of the land. Tauringa Kuri was left behind and Iraia was kept by Taringa kuri -

Page 304 – Tuesday 20 February 1894

- Taringa kuri with him a tamati mana. At that time Taringa kuri left everything in his hands to manage for him and after Taringa kuri's death he was left to collect the rent and on the Lease terminating he made a fresh one.

Kaniera also joined in the purchase of Section 84 from the Government.

He states that some of the persons who first joined in the purchase were unable finally to pay for the land.

Taringakuri stated that these persons who had not paid for the Section should vacate themselves on other land belonging to them

Some got land at Otari and some at Kaiwharawhara and Pakuwao [sic] and also Pakuratahi. Te Teira got land at Pakuratahi and also Hemi Kopa.

The names that are in the Lease are those of persons who were living there but had no right to the land.

The genealogy of Taringakuri is in the Court records but there is an additional piece not on record.

Wiremu Omere got land at Otari

The rent was paid to Mikitoa and Ramera .

There was only one rent given to the others. This payment was made at the time the Lease was renewed in 1872 Hei oroha te take

It was 3 years after went to the -

Page 307 – Tuesday 20 February 1894

Section that Mauihakono was Leased to the pakeka. John McHardie and Charles Mabey. After Mr Mabey died McHardie transferred the Lease to J Robinson

Don't know when the first Lease was made but it was for 21 years at a rent of £26 per annum. I was only a youngster. John Robinson occupied the balance of the term. When that was expired a fresh Lease was made see Memo of 09th December 1872

Taringakuri was alive at the time. The other Natives who threatened Mr Robinson did not pay anything to either Taurangakuri or myself.

The lease was made and a Horse was given in payment but I did not get the Horse until 2 years after Taringakuri's death. It was about 5 years after the 2nd Lease was made that Taringakuri died.

I don't know what "take" the others had to the land that they were allowed to join in the Lease. I cant say why Taringakuri and Raniera consented to the others joining in the Lease excepting that they belong to the hapu

Page 309 – Wednesday 21 February 1894 (2/- paid Hearing £1 paid)

Mauihakono Sections 98 and 102 Upper Hutt

Mawene Hohua called and sworn I know the land called Mauihakono (owned by NagatiTama)

I have been at their Section Mauihakono was cultivated by Tauringakuri I went to Mauihakono in 1858 Tauringakuri was the only person living there Other members of his party were at Pakuratahi, Kauwarawara, Otari, Oharui. These were the places that Taringakono said were for his young people. The land at Mauihakono-

Page 310 – Wednesday 21 February 1894

-Mauihakono he kept for himself

His young people were absent at Moharekauri. They returned from there in 1848 others in 1850. On their return they joined Tauringakuri They lived first at Kaiwarawara It was after this that Taurangikuri went up the Hutt and his young people and mokopuna they settled at the Section.

The persons who were at Kaiwharawhara afterwards I remember were

Taringakuri

Moa te Makakeko

Aperahama Tuhana

Komere Paipa

I can't inform the Court of the names of the persons who were living at the Section I went up the Valley to shoot birds and reached Mauihakono supped the one night. There was only Taringakuri living there. He was living in a wharenikau used togo [sic] there to work and returned to the Section. Was clearing the land when I saw him

Wi Maeraxd [sic] The young people were at the Section I went to the Section at her same time and found the young people there

The Section was brought at the time (1858) only went to that locality once. I know that the Section and the place called Mauihakono are at a distance from each other. The Section was Silverstream

Page 311 – Wednesday 21 February 1894

Land where the Natives were living and others went to the Section to shoot birds. After they returned the Ngatitana from Wharekauri they settled at Kaiwharawhara.

Afterwards they went inland to Mauihakona

I don't know that Taringakuri was an enemy of the Government at the time

There were Europeans living with Tarangikuri at the time I refer to I don't know the names of these Europeans

Moa te Makakeko was at Kaiwharawhara with the other persons I mentioned

I don't know the year that Tarangikuri and others brought Section at Silverstream

It was in 1860 that the land was let. Iraia Kauiera told me that the land was let to a pakeha Wilkins was the European who occupied the land

It was Kariara the father of Iraia who told me that the land was let

By the Observer [sic] Mauihakono was the first place that was occupied by Taringakuri. The reason his going there was that he had been joined by Rainera and others They abandoned Kaiwharawhara then and went up the Hutt

The Natives had obtained the Sections at the time I went there some of the Ngatitama were living at Pakuratahi Te Teria and Hori Paengahiwi were the ones that I heard were living there at the time –

Page 312 – Wednesday 21 February 1894

-Referred to

Iraia Kaniera recalled I don't where Apereahama te Haupatu was living at the time the land was let Koto Mananga was at the Section at that time I don't know who Maurhera Rangitauru is

Iria Riwha he belonged to Ohariu was not at the Section he belonged to Ngatitama

I know Hemi Hira te Horo he went to Wharekauri He took part in the purchase in the Section but it was not his money he belonged to Ngatitama.

Mokipiri Kawhia joined in the purchase of the Section He was the brother of Kawera

I knew te Pou he joined in the purchase of the Section

The Court asked the parties whether a list had been prepared in conformity with the directions of the Court

Wi te Kanae stated that the parties had not yet prepared a List

The Court stated in that case it would prepare a List for consideration and submitted the undermentioned names comprising all the Ngatitama who had signed the original Lease in 1860 as well as the names of three others who belonged to the hapu viz.

The name of the persons marked x are not in the Lease but they were mentioned at the Ngatitama hapu and were living at the Upper Hutt at the time it was signed

The Court requested the parties concerned in the application to take the List outside and consider it as well as add other names if it was found that anyone had been omitted

Page 317 - Wednesday 21 February 1894

Mauihakono Sections 98 and 102 Hutt

Mi Maera informed the Court that Iraia Kamera and party had consented to adopt the List name viz. folio 312/313 submitted by the Court in its entirety but there were some others to be added of persons who belonged to the hapu and had lived at the Section at Silverstream.

Waikitoa Taringakuri, Raniera Kapo, Wekipiri Kapo Kawhia, Hirini te Kapenoa, Aniria Pokawaenga, Orihia Pokawaruga, Kawhia te Hauparuparu, Riuhi te Hauparuparu and the residue amongst the other ten persons in equal shares subject to deduction for the acreage appropriated for Railway purpose. The names of the ten persons are Te Pou, Hori Paengahuru, Moa te Wakakeko, Takarei Tumeke, Matini te Iri, Roto Nauabga, Pene te Kiri, Ropata Matakaipipi, Taituha te Uripoke, Erahira Takirau

Page 320 – Wednesday 21 February 1894

Application for Appointment of Trustee

Application by Hapi Puketapu to be appointed a Trustee for Toherua Hapara a minor 18 years 8 months for all his interest in the several lands in the City of Wellington and the Country District.

Mauihakono Sections 98 and 102 Hutt (order £1)

Ordered that the land be divided into 2 parcels and that a title be issued for Section 98 Hutt in favour of the successors of the aforementioned eight persons viz.

Iraia Kawiera an adult

Whaitauro Kainera

Kapo Kainera;s Successors Viz . Rangirere Kapo of 4 years Uekipiri Kapo in 18 months Mohataoro Kamiera appointed Trustee to Kapo children to the extent of one third 1/3 each for the two first named persons and one third 1/3 to the successors of Kapo Kamiera divided equally subject to the portion utilised for Railway purpose as that a title be issued for Section 102 Hutt in favour of the ten persons referred to or their successors in equal shares but Sections to be Inalienable

1850s	Tarangikuri's and his young people moved to the Hutt
1850s	Tarangikuri of Natai Tama cultivated land by himself
1851	Lease made out for 21 years with John McHardie & Charles Mabey
1858	Section bought at the same time – perhaps Silverstream Section No 84
1858	Mawene Hohua joined Tarangikuri in cultivating the land
1860	Land let – occupied by Wilkins – not known which section No 95, 102, or 84
1864	Charles Mabey died 1864 - John McHardie transferred lease to John Robinson
1864	John Robinson held the transferred lease from 1864 to 1872
1871	Te Kaekaea – Taringakuri died but was stated as alive when new lease made
1871	Native was given Horse by Mr Robinson
1872	New Lease made 09 December 1872
1873	Iria Ramiera received the horse from the native who received it in 1871

The Judge [name] will be necessary that the Government should be represented

Parties Agree

The case therefore adjourned till 10 am tomorrow

Rangikauhata for partition

Mr Pope (for Agricultural Department) I am not clear as to the position I produce lease signed by Mere Ngakere but I do not know that we have taken any steps to definitely occupy a portion. I only received notice yesterday & would ask for time to look into matter & ascertain the value of the land. I am inclined to think that we might be willing to take the piece on the North adjoining 102A.

Tiemi Te Wiki – We are willing to allow that piece for Mere Ngakere's share

Mr Pope – I should like time to consult mu superior officer & to look into the matter

Tiemi Te Wiki – We agree to that

The Judge – I think the Crown is entitled to reasonable opportunity of looking into value & nature of land re & portion of any buildings thereon. If parties cannot agree as to location of shares a fair proportion of good & bad land & of all benefits will be awarded to each
