

SCHOOLS IN UPPER HUTT

(Primary – Intermediate – College)

In the early days of the Colony the provision of education was left to the churches, to private enterprise or particularly in the Southern settlements to public bodies. With the settling up of the Provinces in 1852 the Provincial Councils took over the control of education. Their abolition in 1876 opened the way to the founding of the present national system of free secular and compulsory education through the Education Act 1877. The Act provided for the establishment of a central Department of Education under the control of a Cabinet Minister, Secretary, Inspector General (combined with the office of Secretary in 1886) and a small staff of officers and clerks. Control of the school system was left in the hands of twelve District Education Boards. The Hutt valley came under the Wellington Education Board. In 1906 the Wellington Teachers college reopened. 1907 the School journal was first issued. 1919 the dental service was established then later transferred to the Health Department. 1921 the Education Gazette was instituted. 1922 Intermediate school began.

Education Board Outwards Letter books Inspectors (Robert Less) April 1874 to August 1891

The letter book has an alphabetical index in the front which lists surname and address plus letter number. School are not listed in the alphabetical index. All letters are held in the same volume in order of number making it very easy to locate the correct correspondence. Reading the writing can be bothersome at time but in general one can make out the words in the documents.

NOTE - It is not known when Mungaroa School changed its name to Te Marua School but it would have been after 1913 and before 1920 when a new school was opened in the name of Mungaroa but this time it was situated in Mungaroa Valley not Akatarawa.

Wanted a resident Priest - For some time past the Roman Catholic residents of the district have realised the pressing need for a resident priest and local school. It is now some years since the school project was put in hand four allotments of land with frontages to the Main road, Wilson Street and Martin Street were secured. The building was subscribed for by members of the congregation and friends and the piles for the building actually placed upon the ground, where they are still to be seen. Unfortunately the Lower Hutt antagonism, which has always been manifested towards any diminution of its jurisdiction, was sufficiently powerful to postpone the fulfilment of the desires of the residents of the Mangaroa Riding, just as it was sufficient to defeat for a time the aspirations of the Petone faithful for a church of their own. It is rumoured and probably not without some foundation that the removal of St Joseph's Industrial School from Wellington to Upper Hutt was viewed with disfavour from the same source. The remarks of his Grace the Archbishop, "that the time was not far distant when it would be necessary to constitute Upper Hutt a district parish and to station a resident priest there should encourage those progressive persons, who have contended that the spiritual needs of their families are neglected under the present regime, to further efforts in the direction of an early fulfilment of their Archbishop's prediction. The location of some 80 extra souls in the settlement and the immediate need of enlargement of the church are sufficient argument that a resident priest is required. The presence of members of the Order of the Sisters of Mercy rendered the teaching of the children of Catholic parents an easy matter, especially as the amount required for the erection of the school building has been guaranteed for some time. There are those who recollect some few years ago that when the Hutt priest and Hutt doctor were sent for to attend a dying man, the priest arrived too late to administer the Sacrament of Extreme Unction and the only religious consolations afforded the sufferer were the Prayers for Dying read by Dr Purdy. When it is contended by the Church of Home that necessity of affording the "last rites" to the dying is an essential article of faith, it is a matter of urgency with a large resident body of Catholics in the district, including the Sisterhood and Industrial School children, that a resident priest should be appointed immediately. The Archbishop is surely not aware that at a recent funeral, conducted at St Joseph's Upper Hutt, the sorrowing relatives were congratulated upon the fact that the deceased had a stroke of luck in receiving the last rites of the Church thus indicating most clearly that the dying Catholic in the Mangaroa Riding could only expect to receive the "Last Sacrament" as a matter of pure chance, where he had a right to hope for a certainty.

Te Marua School - Diamond Jubilee - On Saturday the Te Marua School near Upper Hutt will celebrate its diamond jubilee the original school having been opened on 03 June 1879. At that time it was known as the Maungaroo (Mungaroo) School the name being changed to Te Marua on 07 April 1913 on account of confusion with Mangaroo Valley. The first school was held in what is now the head teacher's residence. On 19 July 1882 a one roomed school was opened and on 27 August 1912 a second room was added. The first teacher was Mrs E H Evans who remained in charge until 31 March 1911 a period of almost 32 years probably a record for New Zealand.

On the opening day 19 pupils were enrolled, the first to be entered being Mr J T Benge of Upper Hutt. The following Monday 10 more pupils were enrolled while at the end of the year the roll number was 49. Of the 19 foundation pupils 12 are still alive. The following six will be present - Messrs J T Benge, James Johnson, Arthur Evans and Madame's Mabey (nee Elizabeth Benge), C C Jackson (nee Mabel Evans) and S Poulsen (nee Sarah Johnson). Of the second day pupils Messrs John Lawry, John McDonald, and Ernest Pink will also be there. Of the 886 pupils enrolled in the school over half were traced and on Saturday next over 200 past and present pupils will assemble at the school many coming from as far north as Auckland. A notable feature on the compiling of the rolls was that only three ex-pupils were located in the South Island.

Since Mrs Evans the following have been in charge. Miss A L Banks (now Mrs Brown), Miss E A Wallace (February to August 1920), Mr A E Barrowclough (1920-21), Miss M E Oswin (1921-25), Mrs L E Smeaton (1926-27), Mrs A Wheatley (1927-37) and Mr W A Macnab (1937-39). In 1912 the first assistant teacher was appointed. Of the above Mrs Evans and Mr Barrowclough are now deceased. The following have notified

their intention of being present next Saturday, Mrs Brown, Mrs Wheatley, and Mr Macnab, together with Miss Pilling (now Mrs Benge) and Miss Kershaw (assistant teachers). An apology has also been received from Miss Oswin.

Te Marua's Scholastic Jubilee - The inter relationship of Wellington City and the Hutt Valley is an interesting theme of which there has been too little literary recognition. When the founders came in 1839-40 they regarded the valley as the centre of white settlement and the ephemeral Britannia on the Hutt littoral was the result. After the white settlers under stress of weather and other influences, crossed the harbour from Petone beach to Port Nicholson it became clear that the development of the Hutt Valley would be slow and slow it certainly was, nevertheless it has passed through some very interesting phases. If there is in print any satisfactory chronological record of progress and change in the valley from 1840 to date, we do not know of it. We know that four years after the founding the first sheep to enter the Wairarapa were driven round the coast (via Wainui-o-mata, the Orongorongo shore and Mukamuka) because there was no road then (and not for many years thereafter) along the inland route over the Rimutaka Saddle. One of the founders of Greytown in 1853 has left on record the story of the crossing of the Rimutaka in that year by the pioneer families with the aid of pack bullocks, by a bush track which starting from the then road terminus at the Golden Fleece Hotel (vanished!) near the Pakuratahi Stream led over the divide to what is now Featherston. This pioneer makes some amusing comments in jingle on the "toon" built by Jimmy Broun (Brown) which "the earthquake" shook "doon," meaning apparently the first big earthquake (1848), since the second did not occur till 1855. That "toon" was evidently Upper Hutt and the Greytown pioneers if they went that way, must have passed near what is now the little township of Te Marua about a couple of miles north of Upper Hutt. And Te Marua really provides the occasion for these remarks because on Saturday the Te Marua School will celebrate its diamond jubilee. It may be a surprise to many people that the Te Marua hamlet had a school as long ago as 1879. In the Upper Hutt region there are three families whose names constantly recur - Brown (James Brown is regarded as Upper Hutt's pioneer), Benge, and Whiteman - and it is noteworthy that the first pupil enrolled on the opening day of the Te "Mania School was Mr J T Benge of Upper Hutt. If the diamond jubilee of Te Marua with its gathering of first pupils and old identities will inspire some capable person to put even the upper valley chronicles in better order, a work valuable to posterity and in key with the Centennial spirit will have been begun. It should be added that if Wellington City is deemed to be too congested for industries and if industrial development is concentrated entirely in the Hutt region the day when the Hutt Valley will house more people than the city itself may come rather sooner than is expected.

Consolidation Issue - A letter from the Kaitoke School Committee read at today's meeting of the Wellington Education Board stated that for some time there had been growing dissatisfaction at the quick changes of teachers and the lack of competition because of the smallness of the school. It was felt by all concerned the letter added that under such conditions the children were getting far from a reasonable chance to gain real benefit from their primary education. A parents meeting had unanimously decided to ask the board to arrange for consolidation on the Upper Hutt School. The chairman Mr W V Dyer said that after the Kaitoke School had been burnt down the school had been moved to the Te Marua School and the two schools were conducted independently in the one building. If the Kaitoke children went to Upper Hutt they would have the benefit of attending a larger school and the same thing applied to Te Marua. In the latter case however the parents some years ago had been unanimously against consolidation. It was decided to send on the Kaitoke application to the Education Department and to reopen with the Te Marua parents the question of consolidation.
