The World War One service personnel total 31 of which 9 (highlighted in red) were killed in action and 22 returned home after the war. The 9 service personnel who were killed in action are not recorded on the Upper Hutt City memorial plaque outside the Upper Hutt City Chambers on Fergusson Drive.
