Archibald LECKIE aged 37 years bachelor occupation Cater dwelling place Dunedin and Mary COLLINS aged 21 years spinster occupation Domestic Duties dwelling place Dunedin intend to marry In the house of Rev William Pureton Musselburgh by the Roman Catholic Minister Rev W Pureton. Archibald had dwelled in Dunedin for 14 days and Mary for 3 days.

Archibald LECKIE aged 37 born Scotland bachelor Carter and Mary COLLINS aged 21 born Ireland spinster married on 25 March 1884 residence of Rev W B PURTON Musselburgh. Both couples stated that their present residence was Dunedin and usual residence Timaru. Archibald's parents were Agnes formerly MCQUEEN and Stewart LECKIE Labourer. Mary's parents were Mary formerly CASH and John COLLINS Labourer. The witnesses were Stewart LECKIE and Agnes TAYLOR. Stewart was Archibald's older brother and Agnes Stewart's married daughter. The minister was William B PURTON.

Evening Post – 8 August 1912

An inquest was held yesterday by Dr McArthur, district coroner, concerning the death of Mr Stewart Leckie, who was thrown from a horse in Webb street on Monday last. The evidence showed that as Mr, Leckie was mounting the horse it became restive, and he was thrown heavily on the curbing of the footpath. Medical testimony was to the effect that deceased suffered concussion of the brain. A verdict was returned accordingly.

Archibald LECKIE aged 78 born Glasgow Scotland Labourer died 23<sup>rd</sup> April 1914 at Naseby. Cause Chronic bronchitis cardiac failure 4 hours as certified by Dr C I Lillie on 23 April. His parents were Agnes formerly MCQUEEN and Stewart LECKIE occupation Gentleman. He was buried Southern Cemetery 26 April 1914 on undertaker certificate Rev Robert Fairmaid Presbyterian Minister. Archibald had dwelled in New Zealand for 50 years and married aged 37 to Mary formerly Collins. His widow was aged 50 years and living issue were 2 males aged 28 & 25 years and 3 females aged 23, 22 & 21 years. The undertaker Thos. Mitchell of Ranfurly registered the death on 24<sup>th</sup> April 1914
