James Smith LESSELS baptised 31 March 1882 Parish of Hillingdon Middlesex London England. His parents were John and Margaret LESSELS (child born 11 April 1856) abode Hayes father's trade or profession Architect ceremony performed by Vicar J M THOMAS

James Smith LESSELS left England travelling to Africa then Australia somewhere between 1882 and 1886 aged between 18 and 21 years.

According to family stories James arrived in Auckland around 1886 (aged 21) and saw the famous Pink and White Terraces in Rotorua before they were destroyed. On 10 June 1886 a major six-hour eruption of Mt Tarawera killed 153 people. It also destroyed the natural wonders of the Pink and White Terraces which were completely obliterated. Earthquakes accompanied the eruptions.

According to James's 1934 death registration it stated that he dwelled in New Zealand for 50 years which means he arrived in New Zealand about 1884.

I searched Archives NZ Auckland shipping records and could not locate any information regarding James's arrival in Auckland New Zealand.

James arrives in New Plymouth around April 1894. This is according to his intention to marry application.

James's occupation was painter the same as the witness Charles William GREIG. I believe they may have been working together as painters in New Plymouth.

Charles William GREIG of Pendarves Street New Plymouth married Minnie ORGAN 1895 New Zealand. I believe Minnie was a cousin to Mary Ann ORGAN. Charles William GREIG died 1934 Spring-grove/Brightwater Nelson NZ occupation painter and his wife Minnie died 1944 Spring-grove Nelson NZ.

Mary Ann LESSELS aged 24 years born in the Province of Marlborough NZ died on 03 March 1897 at New Plymouth Hospital. Cause of death was Typhoid Fever 17 days as certified by the Medical Attendant Dr P J O'Carroll who saw her last on 03 March 1897. Her parents were Mary Ann formerly JACKSON and Henry ORGAN occupation Shoemaker. She was buried on 05 March 1897 at Te Henui Cemetery New Plymouth by the Episcopalian minister Rev F G EVANS. She married at age 22 to John LESSELS New Plymouth and her living issue was 1 female age 2 years. The undertaker Malcolm CLOW of New Plymouth registered the death on 08 March 1897. The deputy registrar was John MACKENZIE.

There is no Headstone and this triple plot but a concrete border surrounds the grave which was reserved by J. LESSELLS. The plot is next to CLERE and PUTT. Direction to the grave are, drive into the cemetery and park straight after the roundabout near the large tree. Then walk down the row immediately on your right, stop after the 5th row on you left, turn left and walk down this row the plot should be the 2nd on your left. The plot is before the headstone of Andrew ANDERSON born Sweden 1876 died July 1923.

Some time after the death of his wife Mary Ann, James's made a decision and moved to Nelson to be near his late wife's family so they could assist him in taking care of his baby daughter Ivy Gillies LESSELS.

Brightwater was where James's late wife May Ann's parents and family lived. Family story says that James and his daughter Ivy were living with the ORGAN in Brightwater during this period.

It was while working in Nelson that James met and married Bertha MANSSSEN.

Bertha MANSSSEN was born 09 April 1878 Stoke Suburban South Nelson New Zealand. Her parents were Emma Elizabeth formerly MARRIS age 25 born Sheffield York England and Charles Frederick MANSSSEN age 30 years born Nelson NZ occupation Labourer. Bertha's parents were married 03 June 1874 Wellington NZ. E. E. MANSSSEN the mother of Stoke Suburban North registered the birth on 17 May 1878. The registrar was Robert PICKETT.

After the death of his wife James employed a housekeeper to look after the children but this woman proved to be unreliable and in the end he managed the household and running his business all on his own. James's son told me that his father gave each child

the responsibility of looking after and out for the child immediately younger than themselves.

The oldest daughter Ivy was unable to assist James' as she was living away from home training to be a nurse. The next daughter Olive was also unable to assist her father as she was employed and living away from home waiting to start her training to be a nurse.

The youngest daughter Rita was only two months old when her mother died and she went to live with Bertha brother and his wife who had no children of their own. The middle daughter Vera who was a witness to her mother's accident was taken into the care of James's bachelor brother William who had settled in New Zealand. I was told that William took Vera back to England for a holiday and when they returned she returned to live with her father and siblings in Milton Street.

James did a grand job of bringing up his 7 sons on his own as even though they did not have the presence of a woman in the household they were respectful towards women and all had good manners. They were also all very domesticated, which is understandable.

DOCUMENTARY ADDS CONTACT by Meg Davidson
BALCLUTHA - The red-gold hair, the dry wit - these qualities of Elaine Marett's father survive in her own children. But Mrs Marett, of Owaka, never knew her father. She was just five month old when 209th light artillery anti-aircraft battery gunner William David Feron went to fight in World War 2. He was killed in the Solomon Islands on October 1, 1943, and at 21, her mother was left a widow with two young children.
Through the years Mrs Marett has searched alone for clues to the father she never knew.
A hoard of carefully kept newspaper clippings, letters and photographs tell the story of how fair-haired 26 years-old was among 11 anti-aircraft gunners and four other killed by a Japanese bomber at Vella Lavella. As the bomber swooped in, the gunners kept firing. A bomb dropped right in their midst.
On Sunday, new information was added to Mrs Marett's precious hoard. A TV documentary showed the memorial, bearing her father's name, erected where the men died.
But the concrete memorial has been damaged and Mrs Marett is keen to see it restored.
She also has a new contact to follow up - war veteran Bill Ashton, of Alexandra, who served on Vella Lavella and was shown visiting the memorial. Mr Ashton did not know her father but the conditions they experienced were the same. Mrs Marett hopes their meeting will add more pieces to the jigsaw of her long-lost father's life.

VELLA LAVELLA, November 28,
In a setting of palm-fringed coral shore stands a simple memorial stone of white concrete bearing a plaque of names, perpetuating the memory of a number of brave New Zealanders who were killed on this spot shortly after the initial landing was made by our forces. Before a large gathering of New Zealand and American troops the memorial was unveiled today by the officer commanding the

unit to which the men belonged. This is the first memorial erected to the men of the Second N.Z.E.F. in the Pacific during the present war.

A landing vessel was unloading at the beach when Japanese aircraft made a sudden attack. Gallantly the men stuck to their post till a bomb struck the position, killing all in the group and injuring a number besides. The memorial was erected on the beach by men of their battery. The service was opened by an American Navy band playing a musical recital. There followed the playing of hymns, an address by the Rev G.R. Thompson, C.F., and the unveiling of the unit placed a fern wreath on the memorial, and the "Last Post" was sounded.

"These men who have died were our comrades," said Mr Thompson. "We knew them intimately, we knew their sorrows and grief's, their hopes and joys. Eight weeks ago today they were as we are now - well and strong. This very glade in which we stand was the last earthly scene they beheld. This is a holy day. The scene as it is now for us will be ever sacred, sacred to the memory of our friends."

Major-General Barrowclough's expressed confidence in the men of his division has not been misplaced, the men of the Third New Zealand Division had not failed when the testing time came, continued the padre. "Through their baptism of fire and their sacrifice has come to us fresh determination to continue and succeed in our task," he said. "The best way to repay these fellow-New Zealanders who have made the supreme sacrifice is to rededicate ourselves to the task on hand and to carry on till our goal is won.

"We honour the memory of these gallant men. These are parents, wives, sweethearts, who will remember with sadness their last memory of their dear ones. We pray that they may find solace in their sorrows. We salute these men who have left us, and we trust that we may be worthy of their great sacrifice."

The plaque on the memorial bears the following names: Temporary-Sergeant M.J. Healy(Temuka), Lance-Bombardiers A,J,M. Haddock (Huntly), K.P. Fitzgerald (Matamata) and R.W. Murray (Wanganui), Gunners N.C. Carmichael (Pokaka), R.P. - ? (Christchurch), S Dawson (?ford), W.D. Feron (?), H.Hand (Dunedin)

Painter Injured By Contact With High Voltage Line.
A painter narrowly escaped electrocution today when he came in contact with a high voltage power line above the veranda on the T.A.B. building in Bridge Street.
The accident happened about 1.35 p.m. when Mr Alec Neil Lessels, aged about 46, of 72 Weka Street, was carrying a ladder along the roof of the veranda. It is believed that the ladder caught on an obstruction and Mr Lessels was flung against a lower line.
The shock knocked him unconscious, and badly burned his left shoulder. He was attended by Dr K.M. Galloway, and taken by ambulance to the Nelson Public Hospital.
While Mr Lessels was being attended, the power line he fell against snapped cutting off the supply to most of the block. A large crowd quickly gathered in the area.
Nelson City Council electricians were on the scene almost immediately and expected to have power restored in a short time.
