The family history of
William MARRIS and Ann CUTHBERT

William MARRIS was born and christened on 23 March 1825 in Rowston Lincoln England. He was the eldest son of Elisabeth formerly HANNAH and William MARRIS of Walcot Fen Lincs. He was christened in the Anglican Church at Rowston.

Nothing is known of William's school days but he received a good education, as I was told at one time he was an accountant. He started work as a draper apprentice around the age of 15 where he worked for Messrs R. G. Gray & Co., the drapers of 43 Exchange Street Sheffield. Messrs Gray & Co., were in business from 1849-54 and at other addresses until at least 1863. It was while working here that William met and married his first wife Annie CUTHBERT.

Ann or Annie CUTHBERT was born about 1826 in England. Her marriage records state that her father was John CUTHBERT occupation Innkeeper. The 1851 census records that she was born in Isle of Wight.

There is a record of an Ann CUTHBERT who was christened on 02 April 1826 in Durham, Lanchester, England and her parents were recorded as Mary and John. I do not think this christening belongs to our Ann as the story handed down through generation's state that Ann was born in the Isle of Wight.

William MARRIS age 25 years bachelor occupation Draper married Anne CUTHBERT age 24 years spinster on 02 March 1850 at the Parish Church Sheffield York England. William's residence was Sheffield and Anne residence was Sheffield Park. William's father was William MARRIS Farmer. Anne's father was John CUTHBERT Inn Keeper. They were married by licence in the parish church by Edward MURPHY. The witnesses were Henry HARWOOD and Emma GRAY.

I searched the 1851 census to find out more about the witnesses as I thought it might give me some clue to find out more about Ann and William.

Henry must have worked with William, as both their occupation were drapers.

I thought at first that the witness Emma GRAY could have been a member of the GRAY family who owned the firm where William worked.

In 1851 William's younger brother John MARRIS was living with Emma and her husband George GRAY. The census also recorded that Emma was born in the Isle of Wight the same as Anne. I then thought that perhaps Ann and Emma were sisters. I located the 1841 census, which recorded Anne and Emma living together along with another sister Sarah CUTHBERT. Emma had married George GRAY who years before Anne married.

Around 1851 William and Annie had a stillborn son. This information was recorded on William and Ann's divorce papers.

William and Annie had a daughter Emma Elizabeth MARRIS was born 17 October 1852 1 Manton Street Sheffield in the County of York England. Her parents were Annie formerly CUTHBERT and William MARRIS occupation draper. Annie MARRIS mother of 1 Manton Street Sheffield registered the birth on 28 October 1852. The deputy registrar was Henry WILSON.

Emma Elizabeth MARRIS was baptised at St Johns Church Sheffield York England.

In 1855 William and his wife and daughter left Sheffield. William was held in high regard by the company and was presented with a silver tea service inscribed as follows, "This Tea Service presented to Mr William MARRIS as a mark of esteem by the firm and assistants of Messrs R. & G. Gray & Co. Sheffield June 21st 1855." Identification and other marks "DD & SPGS 1384 SD'. This tea service is now a valued family heirloom of Living MARRIS family in Nelson New Zealand.

After leaving Sheffield William and Ann lived in Manchester, Sleaford and Clyde Street Nottingham. William carried on the business of wholesale and retail draper in South Parade and also at 7 Haymarket Leicester. For a short period in 1856 he took charge of his Aunt's (Dorcas MARRIS born 15 September 1795 England) shop at Normanby by Spital in Lincolnshire, the village where his grandfather had lived for many years.

On the 17th July 1860 while living in Clyde Street Nottingham William's wife Annie left him and ran away with William BURKE an assistant to Messrs Frisby Dyke of Liverpool. In the months from July to December 1860 the districts mentioned where Annie and William BURKE were living were Beeston, Nottingham and at Stull in the County of York and elsewhere in England.

From Nottingham William went to London and worked for Messrs Thomas Green & Graham warehousemen of 27 Saint Pauls Churchyard. We believe he was employed as a clerk or accountant. It was here on March 1861 that he filled to the Court for a divorce. This was granted by the judicial decision of Sir Cresswell on the 31st January 1862.

William and Anne's daughter Emma was only 8 years old when her parents divorced so she went to live with her grandmother Elizabeth MARRIS at Walcot Fen Lincolnshire. Her grandmother looked after her until her father's 2nd marriage in 1862.

While William was in London his little daughter Emma wrote him a letter:

Written In Walcot Fen

Mr Dear Papa,

I take up my pen to write a letter out of Fen

so you must excuse each mistake and the next I send a better will make

It is not for want of affection here that I did not write to Papa so dear

for Grandma and Aunt has been busy each day and I have been helping to heap up the hay

Jim has began to mow the bank and Uncle Osgerby has come down is lean and lank

He has broken his horse's knees and poor people begin to sneeze

He sold Doctor Foster for a £60 debt so up to London he has gone and the country left

Should you in the city meet no doubt you will him greet

Grandma and Aunt join in love with me hoping soon your face to see

From your affectionate daughter

Emma E MARRIS

Walcot Fen July 15 1861

When William's father died in 1858 the informant of his death was recorded as Joseph UTTING from Walcot.

In 1862 William returned to Walcot farm where he farmed for a short while and on the 14 October 1862 married Betsy Anne UTTING. Family stories say that Betsy Anne UTTING had previously been the Governess of William's daughter Emma.

Betsy/Betsey Ann UTTING was born about 1836-1837 South Lincolnshire Middle Hassin [sic] Lincolnshire. Her father was recorded as Benjamin UTTING occupation farmer. Another researcher gave me her parents as Frances formerly WADDINGHAM and Thomas UTTING.

The family history of William MARRIS and Betsy Anne UTTING

William MARRIS age 37 years (widower being divorced from wife by Judicial decision of Sir Cresswell dated 31 January 1862) occupation Farmer married Betsy Anne UTTING aged 24 years occupation spinster on 14 October 1862 at the Wesleyan Chapel, Martin near Timberland district of Sleaford in the County of Lincoln England. A village about 2 miles north of Walcot. John Nicholson the Wesleyan Minister married the couple. The residence for William was recorded, as Walcot Fen near Billinghay and Betsey's residence was Welbourn. William's father was William Marris (deceased) occupation Farmer and Betsey's father was Benjamin Utting Farmer. The witnesses were Fanny MINNITT & Robert HOLLINGHEAD. Robert was William's brother in law who was

married to his sister Mary A HOLLINGHEAD formerly MARRIS. I have not searched for details regarding the witness Fanny MINNETT.

In the five weeks following their marriage they were busy preparing for a journey to New Zealand. Early in the winter of 1862 William & Betsy said farewell to relatives and friends then travelled down to London with daughter Emma and joined the Barque "Electra" which was due to sail from London Docks on the 18 November 1862 for Nelson New Zealand.

The "Electra" left Gravesend England on 08 December 1862 and arrived on 30th March 1863 (Good Friday) in Nelson New Zealand.

ELECTRA 606 tons Captain WOODGATE from London, arrived 30th March 1863, 110 days from Downs, an apprentice, WEST was lost during a gale on the night of 26 February while on watch on for castle. A male passenger was also drowned, he was skylarking by hanging to the fore top brace on the night of 01 January fell overboard, and was drowned. Details of other voyages made by this ship are published in Volume II "White Wings".

The Electra made her first voyage to Nelson arriving there on the 30th March 1863. Captain WOODGATE reported that during a heavy gale an apprentice was lost overboard and William HUTCHESON while skylarking, hanging on to the fore port brace, fell overboard, and was drowned.

While she could not be called a fast ship the "Electra" made better time on her numerous voyages to New Zealand than most ships of her size in the 1850's and 1860's. There are not as far as can be discovered, any records of the route, but it is safe to assume that it would be from the "Downs" heading south across the equator into the South Atlantic until somewhere about 50-60 degrees south and turning eastwards she would speed over the ocean before the strong westerly winds of the "roaring forties", until nearing New Zealand. The report of the voyage does not mention their having called at any posts.

The ELECTRA was a barque of 606 tons and carried passengers and cargo. Lloyds of London have supplied some of the following information.

She was built St Sutherland, England in 1855 and was owned by Shields & Co of Newcastle and about 1857 was transferred to Morice & Co. of London. From about 1862 – 1866. She was owned by Mr William Cheshire and from 1866 onwards she became a Shaw Saville & Albion ship.

Probable the first voyage she made under Cheshire ownership was to Nelson NZ in 1862-63. William and Betsy Ann joined the ship at London on the 18th November 1862 but it was to be a few weeks before they left on 08 December 1862 from the Downs off Deal in Kent where sailing ships used to wait pending their final departure for overseas ports.

"Colonist" newspaper Nelson Tuesday March 31 1863

Arrival of the London Passenger ship "ELECTRA" at Nelson. The ship Electra (Capt John WOODGATE, master) from Deal, December 2nd, was sighted from the lookout station here early yesterday morning and anchored about a couple of miles from the harbour shortly after noon.

She is 11 days out from the Downs and 102 days from land, to land. On her passage out the Electra signalled vessels on the following dates:

January 3,8,12,13,19,22,27, February 3.7. The Electra, with passengers and general cargo, had been expected for sometime. Former mails having stated she was due to sail from London on November 18th. Later mails however indicated that she did not leave the Downs until December 8th, although hauled from docks on November the 26th. The delay was due to the need for a new jib-boom to replace the old one found to be rotten after the official survey.

Very rough weather in the English Channel, and on 16th the ship was driven near the Irish coast. After clearing land the passage, though not rapid was agreeable and prosperous, the weather being finer throughout than ever witnessed before by one person on board who had made the passage more than a dozen times before. Only once was it rough - February 25th - when a furious gale came down from the south east and the barometer fell one and a half inches in six hours.

The ship lay to under close-reefed main topsail, and the storm increased, and the glass continued to fall-indicating the approach of the centre of cyclone - so the captain resolved to run before the wind. The ship there fore scudded out of the path of the storm, and in a short time the barometer rose a little, and later the wind abated - but a heavy sea and thick weather prevailed all day. Heavy seas were shipped all over and so one occasion the cabin door being opened to admit a passenger, a large body of water swept along from the bow, and in a moment the saloon floor and the cabins on either side were ankle deep in water and the passengers possessions that lay on the floor of their cabins went sailing into the saloon and bobbed about with every lurch of the ship. It was comical to witness the effects of Stewarts and passengers to clear the water with basins, foot pans, mugs, dustpans and even tumblers. Some water went down through the storeroom hatchway and damaged some passenger's articles and stores. Two persons were drowned on the passage - one a passenger and the other the youngest apprentice, a boy named John WEST, aged fourteen years. West was on the lookout on the forecandle on the night of the storm, from the 8th-12th (Dec) and the vessel was pitching heavily. About 10 o'clock someone was heard to fall, but the boy was not missed until they went to relieve the watch.

A passenger named HUTCHESON, on New Years night during a dancing party in the moonlight climbed up the forepart brace and performed Blondin feats. While hanging by one hand he grasped for another rope but missed and fell 20 feet into the sea. Lifebuoys were thrown and towboats were manned and lowered, but after three hours, as the night was getting dark, bulb lights were burned to guide the boats back to the ship, no sign being found of the passenger or the buoys. (HUTCHESON had been placed on the ship by a policeman and a friend at Gravesend having been an unwilling emigrant. The poor fellow had been rather excited that day and was not quite himself that evening.)

There were the usual amusements of shipboard life to lessen the weariness of a long voyager, and among these were the publication of a newspaper and a very good theatrical entertainment. All of this numerous other incidents of the passage were recorded in the columns of the "Electra Light" the somewhat ambitious title of the magazine published on board. Captain Woodgate as an urbane, gentlemanly and experienced commander and a most agreeable companion, gained for himself during the voyage, the respect and friendship of all on board with whom he came in contact

The Mr BOND who was listed among the passengers later became editor of the "Colonist" so it is highly likely that he had a hand in the production of the "Electra Light". It was apparently Easter on the Friday following their arrival at Nelson and Mr BOND is said to have visited the MARRIS family, and in later years, Emma (MANSSSEN) on this day each year for many years after to commemorate their arrival in NZ.

The Electra spent many days at Nelson Haven unloading and there were numerous advertisements in the newspapers of those times drawing attention of all who might read them to the endless variety of goods as they were unloaded. Would be purchasers should have been well aware of all this as they had been advised since early March of the pending arrival of such goods as paints, varnishes, clothing, furniture, iron ware, crockery and many other items that would be keenly sort after in a new settlement. Late in May the shipping column in the "Colonist" carried notice:-

Shipping May 23 1863

Ship Electra 606 Tons, Capt. WOODGATE, for New Plymouth."

On this Saturday in May the ship, which had safely carried William and his family to these shores set sail never to return to Nelson Haven again. One wonders how many of these people, to whom she had been home for over three months, were they're to see her off or did she slip away on the tide almost unnoticed. It is doubtful, for a ship from "Home" arriving or departing was an important event ion those days when parents, aunts and uncles, brothers and sisters were separated by 12,000 miles of ocean and news of them was eagerly sort after.

A sea captain once said that the sailing ship was the most graceful thing that man had created. Even though he may have been a little biased many would agree with him and would doubtless have been there to see the Electra clear the Fifeshire Rock and then like a great white bird, move proudly and silently across the bay.

The Electra was to return to the NZ Coast many times in the years from 1866 onwards when she became a Shaw Saville & Albion ship and these notes taken from Bretts "White Wings" are of interest:- "She ran to NZ between 66 & 73 several voyages to Wellington none of which exceeded 100 days. On the 1869 voyage they saw ice in the Indian Ocean a thing Capt. SELLERS had never seen. At 64 10s & 121 30e they passed fifty-three icebergs in ninety minutes some of them being over 200 feet high.

In 1887 under Capt. THOMPSON they had a very rough passage. It took some time to clear land when leaving England owing to a gale, and from then on it was gale after gale. They even overshot Nugget Point their first NZ landfall and finally limped into Port Chalmers 140 days out from England.

Up to the last recorded voyage to our shores in 1883 the Electra had spent twenty-eight years of her life sailing the oceans of the world. Of her ultimate end we know nothing and perhaps it is best if we leave it that way. There is an old song which belongs to this bygone age which tells of those "White Wings" that never grow weary." This may have been true but these were also the years that herald the coming of the steamship and so these graceful white ships, the Electra among them, were forced to sail away forever into the mists of time that "progress" leaves behind.

William, Betsy and Emma MARRIS arrived in Nelson New Zealand on the 30 March 1863. Information that the family settled in the Washington Valley Nelson is confirmed by a letter that William write to the Superintendent of Nelson.

Sir

Having seen the Provincial Engineer Mr BLACKETT and ascertained from him that he understands the government will shortly be in want of Clerks or other assistants for different departments in the surveying exploring re of the West Coast. I take the liberty of applying to your Honour, as a candidate for employment should any qualifications be equal to the requirements of any vacancy you may have to fill.

Mr handwriting is before you Arithmetic I have a fair knowledge of also Book keeping by single entry having been more or less employed as a book Keeper over 20 years. I have long accustomed myself to Mechanical Work and any Knowledge of Agriculture, of Carpentry and other kinds of labour has often proven useful and profitable to me and I thing might be of some service should I be placed in a situation where circumstances may render acquaintance with these things necessary.

If I should be successful in obtaining a situation from Government I shall be ready at all times to render myself generally useful as far as any ability allows.

I may mention that I am the person of whom Mr SUCKEY spoke to your Honour a few days ago.

William and Betsy had a son John William MARRIS who was born on 24 January 1864 Nelson NZ.

Nelson Newspaper Notice

On 24th January 1864 at her residence Washington Valley Mrs MARRIS of a son.

William and his business partner placed an advert on the front page of the "Nelson Evening Mail" on the occasion of the publication of its first issue on the 05 March 1866.

Messers HUBBARD & MARRIS Accountants Valuators & General Commission Agents Sell & let property, collect debts & c. Tradesmen's books kept & balance sheets prepared Drapers & Grocers stocks valued or sold on commission

N.B. All communications strictly confidential
Hours of Business 10 till 4.

In April William and Mr Hubbard dissolved the partnership as he was about to purchase another business and these advertisements appeared in the "Evening Mail".

"Dissolution of Partnership
We the undersigned acting as Land & Commission agents
have this day dissolved partnership by mutual consent.
Signed:- Thomas HUBBARD
William MARRIS

This was followed by a further advert advising that the firm continued as Hubbard & Co. However by July 28 after a short partnership Thomas HUBBARD sold the business.

An item of interest appeared in the "Mail" on the 14 November 1866 which disclosed that Jas TAYLOR had given William & Tomas a piece of land to sell and had eventually sold it himself without giving them notice. MARRIS & HUBBARD sued TAYLOR for costs, which they had incurred amounting to £11.9s.3d. They won their case but the magistrate reduced the amount.

The Waimea Road Store

On the 14 June 1866 William MARRIS brought a grocers shop from a Mr J W NEALE for £250. This was part section 644 that appears to be part of town acre 644. To complete this deal William had to borrow £150 from Mr William FIELDS a gardener also of Nelson. [Securely over one third section]. This shop was fairly new having been built in 1859 and was really a house and store of five rooms. On the 14th June 1866 William and Betsy Anne MARRIS were ready to open to customers as the "Mail" printed this notice:-

"WILLIAM MARRIS"
Grocer & Provision Dealer & cet.cet.
Respectfully announces to the public of Nelson and vicinity that
he has taken the Business lately carried on by Mr NEALE in
Waimea Road and trusts by punctual and careful attention to

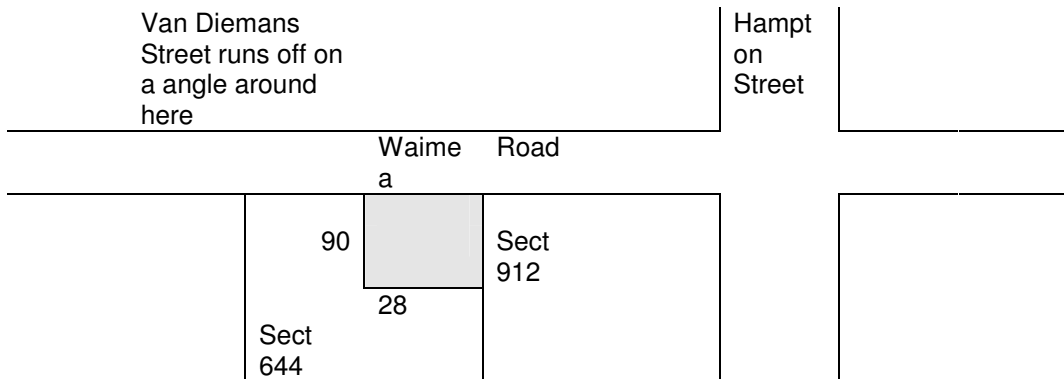

*This probably came about when Betsy Ann had a larger shop built by her son J W MARRIS. The new shop was built over the old one so that business could carry on as usual.

William had the Nelson Evening Mail agency at the shop about 1866 and this remained there for many years afterwards. It seems that the local inhabitants also felt the need for a Post Office as on Mon. May 27 1867 the Leader page of the "Mail" carried this paragraph:-

"We continue to receive grievous complaints relative to the inconvenience to which the residents of the Waimea Rd., and especially those in the vicinity of the College, are subjected through the want of a letter-receiver ion that neighbourhood. It is suggested that Mr MARRIS's store would be a very suitable place for this purpose and we trust the Post Office authorities will recognise the expediency of making such an arrangement."

This must have had some effect as a P.O. was opened at the shop and continued to operate until recent times, probably C1948. The old red pillar-box, which stood on the edge of the footpath, was almost a landmark. It was one of those heavy cast iron monsters over five feet high and made in England. One example had been kept and is to be found at the Museum at Isle.

Soon after he went to the store a fire occurred in Nelson owned by Mr M'Gee Hotel/ in Bridge Street. It was in the early morning of the 07 August 1866. A strong wind was blowing and the fire crossed the street burning down several other buildings - some were insured but there was heavy loss. Shortly afterwards a public meeting was held and as a

result a public appeal was made. There was a good response and among those listed in the Evening Mail was "William MARRIS £1."

William had only been in the shop a little over three years when on the 04 September 1869 he died. He must have taken ill a few days before as his wife said later that he had not made a Will and that he had mentioned this fact to her a few days before he died. It is said that he died after catching a chill doing his delivery round on a cold windy day, having once had pneumonia in England after falling through the ice while skating. It is possible that this remark has been wrongly credited as there is a note written on an old envelope by his son John William and found years later, obviously information given him by his mother stating that his grandmother Francis UTTING died in Lincolnshire (See P) under very similar circumstances. A further note says "Dr Squires says it was failure of the heart through nursing mother during an attack of rheumatic fever." This agrees with the cause of death on the death certificate.

William MARRIS aged 43 years occupation Nelson Store Keeper died on 04 September 1869 in Nelson City. Cause of death was Heart disease. The Undertaker William BRENT of Nelson registered the death on 07 September 1869. The registrar was Rob. PICKETT.

The Evening Mail and Colonist carried similar notices but did not mention Walcot Fen, which was an important find. The public were advised that his funeral would leave his residence in Waimea Road at 2.30 p.m. on Tuesday 7th September.

Written across the corner of the receipt are the words "Native of Welbourne". Why we do not know for neither William nor his wife were born there. The undertaker was William BRENT.

And so on that day in early spring when William was laid to rest he left his widow a son of 5 years and two daughters Emma aged 17 years and Fanny aged 3 years. This son JOHN WILLIAM of NELSON was in fact the only male left to carry on this line of the family of MARRIS as there were no male ancestors who had lived and had issue at least

as far back as his great grandfather JOHN of NORMANBY who may have had other sons.

Search for a Grave

In 1966 none of the family knew where the graves of William and Betsy Ann were located at Wakapuaka so on the 26th of June in that year John of Brightwater his wife Vivienne and sons Richard and Alistair collected Ted (Edmund BULLER) of Stoke and set out to see if it could be found. A call at the Sextons Office produced this information:- Buried in the Wesleyan Lot of Wakapuaka Cemetery Plot No 66 Old No 67.

Armed with this knowledge and directions from the sexton we commenced our search. Even so it was an hour or so before Richard called out "Dad here it is". We had had no idea what we were looking for a headstone or just a plot, so when we saw what Richard had found we all got a surprise. It was a beautiful double grave with a white marble cross six feet high set at the head of it. It was situated some fifty years down the road from Adams Corner. It was all neat and tidy - Obviously arranged by his son John William.

Entrance climb hill to Chapel, follow road up hill on left, round bend on left three quarters up this hill before the top where there is Adams Corner (Monte Carlo Palms).

The inscription at the base of the cross reads:

"In Loving Memory of William MARRIS died 4th Sept. 1869 Aged 43 years
Also of his wife Betsy Ann UTTING died Dec. 13th 1914 Aged 78 years
"In My Fathers House Are Many Mansions"

Betsy Ann MARRIS formerly UTTING married William WALKER about November 1871 in Nelson. Information about this family and descendants are located at the end of this document.

NOTE: A large amount of the MARRIS family genealogy had been research by Living MARRIS of Nelson in New Zealand. He spent many years researching the ancestors of William MARRIS and I am so grateful to him for sharing his research material with me. He is a descendant from the marriage of William MARRIS and Betsy Ann UTTING.

Betsy Ann WALKER age 78 years born South Lincolnshire England, occupation Domestic Duties Widow died on 13 December 1914 Waimea Road Nelson NZ. Cause of Death was Cerebral Thrombosis Coma as certified by Dr S A LUCAS who saw her last on the 13 December 1914. Her parents were recorded as Frances formerly WADDINGHAM and Thomas UTTING. She was married 1st aged 26 years to William MARRIS in Walcot Lincoln and 2nd aged 36 years to William WALKER in Nelson City. Church of Christ Minister Rev S J MATHIESON took the service. She was buried Nelson Cemetery on 15 December 1914. Betsy was recorded as dwelling in New Zealand for 52 years (arriving about 1862). Her living issue were recorded as 2 males aged 40 & 38 years and 2 females aged 42 & 36 years. The Undertaker W E FLEMING of Hardy Street Nelson registered the death on 16 December 1914. The registrar was S TYSON.
