OXFORD CRESCENT SCHOOL STORY

Oxford Crescent School was built and opened in 1952 as a side school with four classrooms. The school was official opened as an independent school on 02 February 1953 with nine classrooms. The school's entrance is at 5 Oxford Crescent with a side entrance from Kowhai Street in the Ebdentown district on part Section No 120.

Section No 120 was once a Native Reserve known as Hokowhitu also spelt Hokowhetu. Hemi Parai and other Maori purchased Section No 120 from the Crown along with the neighbouring Section No 121. Many years later Thomas Moritz St Clair (Tom) Coltman purchased part of Section No 120. Tom developed the land which became known as the Coltman Estate. Oxford Crescent School was sometimes referred to as Coltman Estate School

By 1947 negotiations began to purchase land in the subdivision of the Coltman Estate to establish Oxford Crescent School. Mr Coltman was offered £3500 for 6 acres of land. (Reference Archives NZ Wellington Office R20132393)



The urgent need for proceeding with the school was stressed by Mr McGregor who advocated the immediate approval of the plans to allow the work to be proceeded with whilst negotiations over the grounds were proceeding. Mr Algie in reply agreed that it was imperative that there should be no delay in the completion of the school buildings. He would have the matter looked into immediately. Regarding the Departments proposals re ground work he assured the Upper Hutt people that the new school would be provided with a reasonable developed recreation area. Funds for educational purposes for the financial year ending 31 March 1951 had already been spent and while he was hopeful of getting a further grant from the Minister of Finance (Mr Holland) it was necessary to enforce economies at present. Next year the position might be better. Mr McGregor supported by Mr Smith (headmaster), advocated the provision of a prefabricated classroom for the Upper Hutt School. The need was most urgent. Mr Algie had himself seen the overcrowded conditions and must realise the need for immediate action. Mr Algie offered to lend his support to the Wellington Education Board in endeavouring to meet the position and he hoped that a building would soon be made available.



Oxford Crescent School Group Exponents of Maori Arts and Music – When an Oxford Crescent school teacher was chosen to do a special course in Maori Arts and Crafts run by the Education Department some time ago she little realised that the results would bring official recognition and a certain amount of unwished for but thoroughly deserved publicity. The teacher is Miss Margaret Page and when she returned from the special course she set about sharing her knowledge and enthusiasm with her pupils. Not content with teaching the children Maori action songs, poi dances, hakas and laments, Miss Page decided that as a class project they should equip themselves with the appropriate costumes. A do it yourself programme was undertaken to make the grass skirts, or piu pius, headbands and bodices based on authentic Maori designs. The task was completed in 9 weeks and was undertaken with as much enthusiasm by boys as well as girls. Films Made - The project was so successful especially as the class is 100% pakeha that the Education Department have taken many pictures of the group and shortly will make a film which possibly will be circulated among other schools as an example of what can be achieved by leadership and a positive approach. The bodices and headbands for the costumes were worked in wool in cross stitch in yellow, white, red and black, the yellow being used because it shows up; better at night. The items were originally intended for the Primary School Festival and we didn't visualise performing at other functions, explained Miss Page who went on to describe the making of the flax skirts which are such an important part of the Maori costume. Soothing Tons of flax were cut in the Wallaceville swamp and many parents helped to transport it back to school where we spent hours and hours scraping it, she said. Although pupils from Std 3 upwards are members of the group, the making of the costumes was done entirely by my own class Form 2 and we often had Saturday morning scraping bees. During the week though it was just a part of the normal school programme. Miss Page commented on the soothing effect this work had. The Maoris are more tranquil than we are and working on these projects explains why, she said. The piu pius are beautifully done with the correct black marking. We cheated a

bit there, said Miss Page, we knew that the proper dying would be too complicated, so we used felt pens to get the effect. Concert - The public of Upper Hutt will have an opportunity of hearing and seeing this well trained group of children perform many types of Maori action songs when they will be one of the star attractions at the concert for the Upper Hutt SPCA which is being held at Upper Hutt College on Saturday night 21 November.

Crowded Concert for SPCA Funds - The Grand Concert organised for the Upper Hutt SPCA by prominent musician Mr Alan Heathcote White was one of the best patronised and successful concerts held in Upper Hutt for a long time. Held in the Upper Hutt College Hall, the concert attracted far more people than the hall could hold and extra seating had to be carried in from other parts of the College and even then many had to stand around the walls and at the back of the hall. Consisting as it did of choral items, solos duels, recitations and band selections, the concert had an old-world flavour which was new to younger members of the audience and reminded the folder ones of the good old days before TV and streamlined variety shows changed tastes and standards. Band Music - A high level of entertainment for the evening was set by the splendid opening items given by the Upper Hutt Municipal Band who also played incidental music before the commencement of the programme. Delightful music both choral and solos was heard from choirs from Oxford Crescent School (whose lovely singing of Maori music and colourful appearance in traditional Maori costume charmed the audience), St. Joseph's School, St. Patrick's College. Upper Hutt School and Upper Hutt College (Girls' Choir). Approximately £120 was made by the sale of concert tickets and programmes.

Mr H L Mckinnon MBE MA (Hons) who retires, at the end of this year from the position of Headmaster of the Oxford Crescent School Upper Hutt can look back over a long and varied career in the teaching profession. He received his secondary education at the Southland Boys High School Invercargill trained as a primary teacher at the Dunedin Teachers Training College and eventually graduated M.A. with Honours in History in the University of New Zealand. He began his service as a pupil teacher at Waihopai School Invercargill and after his Training College Course he returned to this school as an assistant teacher. He also served as an assistant master at the Invercargill Borstal Institution. Later he worked as a post-primary teacher in the secondary departments of the Mosgiel and Kurow District High Schools. During the Second World War he served for three years in the Pacific. Towards the end of the War he took charge of the school for the 800 Polish children brought to this country by the New Zealand Government and established in the refugee camp at Pahiatua. He organised the teaching of English to the children and to the adults who accompanied them. It was an usual school for the Polish language history and national handicrafts were also taught. The aim of Mr McKinnon and those associated with him was to prepare the children to take their place in any New Zealand school. His work was appropriately recognised by the award of the M.B.E. in Birthday Honours in 1945. He was sent by the New Zealand Government to study the methods used in the large migrant camps in Australia which had been established to teach English to Displaced Persons. He adapted what he saw there to the conditions he encountered at Pahiatua. Altogether over 4000 new New Zealanders passed through the Centre people of many races and languages were prepared for their entry into the life of their new homeland. When the camp was closed down at the end of 1951 Mr; McKinnon was granted leave of absence to visit Britain and Europe. When the Oxford Crescent School opened in 1953 he was appointed the first headmaster. Proof of Mr Mckinnon's popularity with the Staff is the fact that his school has had very few staff changes during the period of his headmastership. At a special School Assembly held on 07 December the pupils of the school presented him with a Conray Electric Heater and a Mohair Travelling Rug while his present staff gave him an Elizabethan Lounge Chair at an afternoon function later on. The Home and School Association showed their deep appreciation by the gift of a wristlet watch. All who have been associated in any way with Mr McKinnon during his 40 years' service in the Teaching Profession will wish him well in his retirement.

#Oxford Crescent School Group Exponents of Maori Arts and Music - When an Oxford Crescent school teacher was chosen to do a special course in Maori Arts and Crafts run by the Education Department some time ago she little realised that the results would bring official recognition and a certain amount of unwished for but thoroughly deserved publicity. The teacher is Miss Margaret Page and when she returned from the special course she set about sharing her knowledge and enthusiasm with her pupils. Not content with teaching the children Maori action songs, poi dances, hakas and laments, Miss Page decided that as a class project they should equip themselves with the appropriate costumes. A do it yourself programme was undertaken to make the grass skirts, or piu pius, headbands and bodices based on authentic Maori designs. The task was completed in 9 weeks and was undertaken with as much enthusiasm by boys as well as girls. Films Made - The project was so successful especially as the class is 100% pakeha that the Education Department have taken many pictures of the group and shortly will make a film which possibly will be circulated among other schools as an example of what can be achieved by leadership and a positive approach. The bodices and headbands for the costumes were worked in wool in cross stitch in yellow, white, red and black, the yellow being used because it shows up; better at night. The items were originally intended for the Primary School Festival and we didn't visualise performing at other functions, explained Miss Page who went on to describe the making of the flax skirts which are such an important part of the Maori costume. Soothing Tons of flax were cut in the Wallaceville swamp and many parents helped to transport it back to school where we spent hours and hours scraping it, she said. Although pupils from Std 3 upwards are members of the group, the making of the costumes was done entirely by my own class Form 2 and we often had Saturday morning scraping bees. During the week though it was just a part of the normal school programme. Miss Page commented on the soothing effect this work had. The Maoris are more tranquil than we are and working on these projects explains why, she said. The piu pius are beautifully done with the correct black marking. We cheated a bit there, said Miss Page, we knew that the proper dying would be too complicated, so we used felt pens to get the effect. 

Coltman Estate subdivision was developed by Thomas Moritz St Clair (Tom) Coltman who purchased part of Section No 120. Tom developed the land which became known as the Coltman Estate.

Native Reserve Hokowhitu also spelt Hokowhetu was the name of Section No 120. Hemi Parai and other Maori purchased Section No 120 from the Crown along with the neighbouring Section No 121. Many years later Thomas Moritz St Clair (Tom) Coltman purchased part of Section No 120. Tom developed the land which became known as the Coltman Estate.

Streets - Hudson Avenue was named after the Lockheed Hudson bomber. The American built light bomber aircraft was built for the Royal Air Force just before the Second World War. The Hudson served through the war mainly with Coastal Command but also in transport and training. The street was part of the 1949 Coltman subdivision developed by Thomas Moritz St Clair (Tom) Coltman. Tom's son was Flight Lieutenant James Thomas Coltman who served with the Royal New Zealand Air Force during World War Two and flew the Oxford, Hudson and Ventura bombers. The Upper Hutt City Council in 2016 placed a poppy on the street signs for Oxford Crescent, Hudson Avenue, Ventura Avenue and Whitley Avenue as part of the nationwide poppy project. Hudson Avenue was recorded in the Wises NZ Post Office Directory 1955 & 1959 & 1961-1962 volumes.

Streets - Keys Street merged into Parks Street and renamed Kowhai Avenue

Streets - Kowhai Avenue was named after the native Kowhai tree that grew in the area. Kowhai means the colour yellow. The Kowhai is a small woody tree admired for its spectacular yellow flowers. The tree is most popular with Tui and other birds. Kowhai Avenue was an original part of Park Street and Keys Street before both streets were merged and the whole street was renamed Kowhai Avenue. Perhaps the change was due to the early Waldegrave Park Estate subdivision's theme being trees and that most of the streets began at Pine Avenue and now includes Kowhai Avenue. Kowhai Avenue was recorded in the Wises NZ Post Office Directory 1955-1962.

Streets - Oxford Crescent was named after the Airspeed AS 10 Oxford. It was a twin-engine aircraft used for Training British Commonwealth aircrew during the Second World War. The Royal New Zealand Air Force used the Oxford to train aircrew. The streets were part of the 1949 Coltman subdivision developed by Thomas Moritz St Clair (Tom) Coltman. Tom's son was Flight

Lieutenant James Thomas Coltman who served with the Royal New Zealand Air Force during World War Two and he flew the Oxford, Hudson and Ventura bombers.

Streets - Ventura Avenue was named after the Lockheed Ventura bomber. It was a twin engine bomber of World War Two used by United States and British Commonwealth forces. The streets were part of the 1949 Coltman subdivision developed by Thomas Moritz St Clair (Tom) Coltman. Tom's son was Flight Lieutenant James Thomas Coltman who served with the Royal New Zealand Air Force during World War Two and flew the Oxford, Hudson and Ventura bombers. Ventura Avenue was recorded in the Wises NZ Post Office Directory 1955 & 1959 & 1961-1962 volumes. As part of the Nation-wide Poppy Project the Upper Hutt City Council placed a poppy on the street signs of Oxford Crescent, Hudson Avenue, Whitley Avenue and Ventura Avenue

Streets - Whitley Avenue was named after the Armstrong Whitworth A.W.39 Whitley bomber. It was a twin engine aircraft used by the Royal Air Force during World War Two. Whitley Avenue was part of the 1949 Coltman subdivision developed by Thomas Moritz St Clair (Tom) Coltman. Tom's son was Flight Lieutenant James Thomas Coltman who served with the Royal New Zealand Air Force during World War Two and flew the Oxford, Hudson and Ventura bombers. As part of the Nation-wide Poppy Project the Upper Hutt City Council placed a poppy on the street signs of Oxford Crescent, Hudson Avenue, Ventura Avenue and Whitley Avenue. Whitley Avenue was recorded in the Wises NZ Post Office Directory 1955 & 1959 & 1961-1962 volumes
