
Mangaroa and District Roll of Honour

Roll of Honour interesting ceremony at Wallaceville School - A roll of honour in memory of those who went from the Wallaceville district to take part in the Great War was unveiled at the school on Saturday afternoon. The school was beautifully decorated by the ladies for the occasion and accordingly the weather being of the best presented an animated appearance there being close on 150 people present. An interesting and unique feature was the attendance of over 30 soldier patients from Trentham camp. r Frederick Clifford occupied the chair and was supported by Mr W H Field MP and Mr Rishworth both members of the Education Board and by Dr Kemp Upper Hutt and the members of the school committee. The chairman introduced the proceedings and stated that the roll contained the names of thirty one boys who had gone from the district nine of whom had made the supreme sacrifice while twenty two had returned. He also paid a tribute to the work done by the ladies in sending parcels for the use of the troops. The roll was unveiled by Mrs Kemp Upper Hutt who was afterwards presented with a bouquet by Miss E Scholes. Mr Field MP in the course of his speech drew attention to the dangers which the Allies had passed through in March 1918 and contrasted the comparatively happy conditions prevailing in New Zealand today with the sufferings being experienced in some parts of Europe as the result of the war. He also emphasised the necessity of making Germany pay to the utmost of her resources the compensation demanded. Mr Rishworth who followed assured the audience that Germany was by no means a broken country. He dwelt on the value of such rolls of honour in keeping green the memory of those who went in defence of their land drew attention to the intense patriotism both in the Homeland and New Zealand by the backbone of the country the veoman class. Dr Kemp added his testimony from personal experience to the heroism displayed by the New Zealand soldiers especially during that trying time in March 1918 and warned his hearers against believing Germany to be a repentant country. The company then proceeded outside to the school grounds where the National Anthem was sung. In memory of the fallen the flag was lowered to the strains of the Last Post.

An adjournment was thereafter made to Wallaceville Hall where refreshments were provided by the ladies and so a most successful function was brought to a close. (Reference Papers past website New Zealand Times newspaper 10 February 1921 page 9)

When the Wallaceville School situated on Whitemans Valley Road in the Mangaroa Valley closed the War Memorial Board was transferred to the new Mangaroa School situated on Flux Road.

The Mangaroa and District Roll of Honour Memorial board is situated on the wall inside the old Mangaroa School building at 93 Flux Road Mangaroa in Whiteman's Valley. The Mangaroa School was established in 1914 so the names recorded on the memorial board were not former school pupils but people associated with the district.

One plaque records the names of twenty two [22] service personnel from the Mangaroa district who served during World War One and were discharged. The top of the plaque is inscribed:

"Men of Mangaroa and District who have nobly fought for their King and Country in the Great War of 1914-1918.

On a separate plaque it records the names of nine [9] service personnel from the Mangaroa district who died during World War One. The bottom of the plaque is inscribed:
"They died that we might live"
