The difference between local and national rolls of honour

The Commonwealth War Graves entitlement to be recorded on the New Zealand World War One National Roll of Honour was that a service personal must have died between the dates of 4 August 1914 and 31 August 1921.

The Defence Department's entitlement was that the service personnel must have died up to 31 December 1923. Their criteria were divided into 3 sections.

- 1. Service personnel who died while serving
- 2. Service personnel who died after discharge from wounds or disease received while serving
- 3. Service personnel who died while training which included those who died of Influenza (The Great War 1914-1918 New Zealand Expeditionary Force Roll of Honour publication by Defence Department)

After World War One people throughout New Zealand began to form local Memorial Committees and invited residents to nominate former service personnel to be recorded on their Rolls of Honour. For reasons unknown some service personnel who died during the war are not recorded on their local rolls. There were no official rules or guidelines for local Rolls of Honour.

An article in an early New Zealand Herald newspaper explains this quite well.

Some memorial authorities have required a list limited strictly to those who have enlisted in their district.

Others have included the men who were resident in the district at the time of their enlistment, although enlistment took place in another part of the Dominion.

Others, again, have further extended the list by adding to these two classes the names of men who, although they lived in other districts and enlisted there, were born and educated in the district where the memorial was being erected.

There have been cases where the list was made still wider by the inclusion of the names of men whose next-of-kin resided in the district concerned, although the men had not been associated with the community.

Some of the Upper Hutt rolls of honour include the names of local service personnel who served with the British and/or Australian Imperial Force. The Upper Hutt Rolls of Honour also record the Service Personnel who served in World War Two and some other conflicts.

Local war memorials are not a true reflection of just how many local residents served or made that final sacrifice for their country.

Upper Hutt Public School Roll of Honour

The Upper Hutt public school established a World War One Roll of Honour memorial board. Some of the eighty five [85] Service Personnel named on the board served overseas, a few in New Zealand while others were reservists. Twenty one (21) † personnel either died while serving or after discharge with their deaths attributed to war service.

The Hon C J Parr Minister of Education unveiled the honours board on 07 December 1920.

Upper Hutt's first Mayor Angus John MCCURDY created a list of World War One service personnel that were former pupils of the Upper Hutt School. Mr McCurdy had the list checked by the Army Records Section. This list appeared in the Upper Hutt School Jubilee 1864-1989 publication.

Recorded on the Memorial board are the names of three service personnel who are not recorded on McCudy's list. They are: -


Mangaroa and District Roll of Honour

The Mangaroa and District Roll of Honour Memorial board is situated on the wall inside the old Mangaroa School building at 93 Flux Road Mangaroa in Whiteman's Valley. The Mangaroa School was established in 1914 so the names recorded on the memorial board were not former school pupils but people associated with the district. I do not know when the World War One Roll of Honour was unveiled.

One plaque records the names of twenty two [22] service personnel from the Mangaroa district who served during World War One and were discharged. The top of the plaque is inscribed:

"Men of Mangaroa and District who have nobly fought for their King and Country in the Great War of 1914-1918.

On a separate plaque it records the names of nine [9] service personnel from the Mangaroa district who died during World War One. The bottom of the plaque is inscribed:
"They died that we might live"


St Mary's Church Silverstream – World War One

St Mary's Anglican Church is situated on the hill at 13 Terminus Street Silverstream. When soldiers died on the battlefield in World War One often a hastily made wooden cross would mark their burial place. After the war the bodies were exhumed and after reinternment the grave markers were replaced with inscribed headstone. Some of these historical grave markers were offered to the family of the deceased service personnel. Many grave markers came into the possession of family members especially in England. After the war Robert Sefton Adam's mother Jessie was residing in Silverstream. Robert's widow also left England and settled in Silverstream. Jessie attended St Mary's Church in Silverstream and was permitted to place Robert's grave marker on the back wall of the church. Members of the church knitted poppies and placed them around the grave marker. This is probable one of the few grave markers held in New Zealand.

Animal Research Station Wallaceville Roll of Honour

The Animal Research Station in Wallaceville formerly known as the Wallaceville Veterinary Laboratory established a War Memorial Board. The memorial board was once situated in the Ministry for Primary Industries complex at Ward Street Wallaceville in Upper Hutt.

During World War One the horses from the Remount Depot in Gibbons Street Upper Hutt were treated for injuries and illness at the Wallaceville laboratory. When a decision was made to reduce the number of horses held at the Remount Depot in Gibbons Street the Depot was transferred to the Wallaceville laboratory farm. Towards the end of the war the horses were transferred to Tauherenikau near the Featherston Military Camp.

Wallaceville Animal Research Station closed in 2007 and the land was sold in 2014. In 2017 the land was developed for housing and named the "Wallaceville Estate".

After much searching it is still unknown what happened to the Animal Research Station Wallaceville Roll of Honour.

Returned Soldiers Association Roll of Honour

The New Zealand Returned Soldiers Association was founded in 1916 by wounded veterans returning from World War One. The Upper Hutt R.S.A. was formed in 1930 as a sub branch of the Wellington R.S.A. and became an independent branch in 1947. It was not until recent times that the renamed Returned Services Association became involved with the local War Memorial.

In September 1937 the Upper Hutt Borough Council Mayor Angus McCurdy and Returned Soldiers Association began discussions to erect a Soldiers Memorial Hall. The proposed Upper Hutt Soldiers Memorial Hall site was chosen on the corner of Liverpool Street and Main Road South (Fergusson Drive) in Trentham. Nothing else is known about the proposed hall.

The R.S.A. hall in Rosenberg Street was opened in 1941 and RSA members marched from their existing rooms to the new hall but the situation of the old rooms is unknown. Rosenberg Street was renamed Wakefield Street during World War Two.

The R.S.A. moved to new premises in King Street and over the many alterations and additions were made to the building. A decision was made to merge with the Upper Hutt Cosmopolitan Club so the building was sold.

The Upper Hutt Returned Services Association Roll of Honour plaque is situated at the top on the R.S.A. Memorial wall in the Cosmopolitan Club at 11 Logan Street Upper Hutt. The details recorded on the plaque include World War One and World War Two Service Personnel.

The Upper Hutt Returned Services Association memorial plaque records exactly the same service personnel details as the original "Upper Hutt District Military Roll of Honour" that was once situated on the memorial wall outside the Upper Hutt Civic Centre on Fergusson Driver in Upper Hutt

The R.S.A. update the Upper Hutt District Military Roll of Honour outside the Civic Centre and the new plaque was unveiled on Thursday 25 August 2016 at 2 p.m.





The original "Upper Hutt District Military Roll of Honour" plaque was once situated on the memorial wall outside the Upper Hutt Civic Centre on Fergusson Drive. Placed in the World War One section of the plaque was PEARSE P.G.H. who served in World War Two. When the error was discovered the local Returned Service Association decided to upgrade the plaque. In 2016 the plaque was removed the new Upper Hutt District Military Roll of Honour was placed on the memorial wall were the original plaque was once situated.


